CMC members have been attending the meetings of the New Era Farms Community Liaison Committee (NEFCLC) where there has been discussion on a persistent OdOUt problem, plant modifications and a recent teachate problem. The facility has not produced the specified class A compost, The public is well aware of the problems- The NEFCLC was formed only after a major public outcry. CMC members met with the Miller Facility Community Liaison Committee where an interest was expressed in further CMC participation. The Miller Facility running smoothly end producing a specified class A compost,

Members raised questions: on the extent of the leachete problem, the source and correction of the odour, how complaints are handled and the extent of community information.

M. Bernard responded to questions:
