

.2 Possible Public visits for HRM residents.

The Chairman referred to a previous CMC discussion. He indicated that any further visits are at the discretion of HRM and the Waste resources Division. M. Bernard and B. Smith indicated that the Division has a number of commitments for the fall. They will review the level of participation of the CMC community visitation, determine the public interest and identify an appropriate time.

The Chairman responded to M. Bernard that CMC would assist at future public visits with the understanding that CMC is a system monitoring not a management group.

The HRM staff will determine the timing of another public visit to the Otter Lake facility.

The Chairman indicated that he had visited some locations but was not ready to recommend a location.

.4 Update communications committee - newsletter.

Committee member D. Wright reported on a September meeting: the newsletter to be published in early November, three newspapers -The Herald, the Daily News and The Masthead, E. Culham to work with the Executive Director and prepare the next draft for early October, the committee agreed to prepare an article for HRM's newsletter Wasteless scheduled for October. E. Culham will prepare an article.
