


# **CMC Chair Briefing** New FREE Booklet on Landfill Leachate

### LANDFILL LEACHATE

One of the key considerations in landfill management is dealing with landfill leachate – the discoloured, toxic and strong smelling liquid that results when rainwater filters through buried garbage and mixes with chemicals drawn from the waste. The resulting fluid can contain a variety of harmful chemicals. Containing, collecting and treating landfill leachate is therefore important to prevent it from finding its way into aquifers and surface water, and creating environmental pollution.

This free to download booklet written by the Otter Lake Community Monitoring Committee's (CMC's) environmental consultant, **Scott Morash**, explains how leachate is managed by the Otter Lake facility and by landfills in general. This is information all residents, especially those in the area surrounding the Otter Lake Landfill, should have.
